SM signs MOU with Ireland's GMIT

Gaining a degree in agriculture can help to provide students with a range of career paths and opportunities in industries such as food processing, rural enterprise development, product development, environmental management, farm advisory and farm engineering. Apart from agriculture programmes, there are also other undergraduate programmes namely BSc Medical Science, BEng Biomedical/Mechanical Engineering and BBus Accounting offered by GMIT.

GMIT is located in Galway, Ireland which is also dubbed as Ireland's capital of food and culture. It won the prestigious Sunday Times Institute of Technology of the Year award thrice in 2004, 2007 and in 2015. GMIT offers a conducive learning atmosphere with its award winning design for its library and a small student to academic staff ratio of 15:1. Apart from that, any ISM graduates who would like to pursue their studies in GMIT will have the privilege of credit exemption and fee reduction up to 20%. Thus, greatly reducing the duration and cost for completing a degree programme. Scholarships are also available for eligible graduates.
