The group also raised RM824 to buy necessities such as rice, dog food and mosquito repellents as well as donated old newspapers, old towels, and other usable items to the SPCA animal shelter. The activity lasted about three hours.

SPCA Tawau expressed its gratitude to ISM for their dedication to the well-being of these vulnerable animals and hoped that such activities will spread awareness among the locals to protect all animals from suffering and abuse.
