Moreover, students can also transfer their diploma credit hours to degree courses. This will allow them to be exempted from the first year of study or even two years for some degree courses. Without a doubt, this can definitely help in reducing their overall education cost. In short, with the credit-hour transfer system, students now only have to study for three to four years in order to get both Diploma and Degree qualifications.
